Atlases with country statistics and flags – this will be useful during the quiz

Activites

Ask the children if they have ever heard of or visited any of the countries shown – perhaps they know the country because of the Olympics or football teams.

Ask the children to find countries in an atlas and research information about each one and present to the class:

- capital city and major cities
- inhabitants
- significant geographical features – cities, mountains, rivers

When watching the videos, ask the children to note down similarities and differences between each place but also with the local area and the UK.

Paint some large flags of the Spanish speaking countries, label them and make a class display. Alternatively, use A5 paper (landscape) to make flags and attach a drinking straw at the side, like a flag pole, and use as part of a classroom display.

Quiz

Match flags to the countries.

Points to note

Touch the continent names to view the countries then touch any part of the screen to return to the main map.


