

We are learning:

- to describe where you live
- to use the verb 'vivir' (to live)
- to use north, south, east and west



Teacher notes

- Atlases, world map, globe
- Cut up pictures of towns, villages, cities, countryside, seaside
- Photos of the local area, famous world landmarks, aerial photographs

Activites

Revise previous learning by greeting the children and asking them questions from previous units of work:

- Classroom instructions – levantaos, sentoas, escuchad, mirad, silencio, repetid
- ¿Cómo estás?
- ¿Cómo te llamas?
- ¿De qué color es?
- ¿Cuál es tú color favorito?

Revise countries that speak Spanish around the world.

Print the compass direction cards and display them in the correct place in the classroom (use a compass for accuracy). Call out a direction in Spanish – norte, sur, este, oeste - and ask the children to move to the correct part of the room.

Show the map of Spain, point at yourself and introduce the phrase “vivo en Madrid” – I live in Madrid. Point to a child and ask “¿dónde vives?”. They should reply “vivo en ... [your town or city]”. Introduce the question “¿dónde está?” – where is...? - by asking “¿dónde está Barcelona?”. Now ask the children “¿dónde está [your town or city]?”. The children should respond with “está en el [direction]”. Ask the children to work in partners to make a conversation using previous learning and the new learning from this lesson using the example conversations as a model. Now show the UK map and repeat.

Teacher notes

Show the children the different places where people live – in a house, farm etc. Use **escuchad** and **repetid** to practise saying the words with the correct sound. Can the children work in partners to now include these words in their conversation? Vary the questions and responses to include different places and cities in either the UK or Spain. Present the conversations to the class or in an assembly.

- Where do you live?
- I live in a house. I live in [London] in England. [London] is in the South of England.

On the slides of the UK and Spain where there are three characters on the right hand side, click on a character's head to listen to where they live. Ask the children to tell a partner the information each character says.

The final slides introduce other cities in different countries around the world. Can the children include the information given in their partner conversations?

Teacher notes

Discuss the verb **vivir** (to live) and explain that in Spanish the verb changes depending on the singular or plural person – first, second, third. Explain that in English the verb stays the same but only the person word changes. In Spanish both parts change – this is quite complicated so don't worry if the children don't fully understand at first. However this concept does need introducing as the questions and responses change depending on the question asked and the response required, for example “where does he live?”, “he lives in...”, “where do you live?”, “I live in...”.

Quiz

Drag and drop words into the correct order to make sentences.

Points to note

Touch the compass pointer to make it spin in the presentation.

Touch the continent names on the main map to view the countries then touch any part of the screen to return to the main map.

Place the cities and countries flashcards on a world or UK map to help the children learn the names of the countries and cities.

Remember to praise the children with **excelente**, **muy bien**, **genial** and **maravilloso** (marvellous).
